Target groups:	This project is intended just for women and girls from the age 15-30, including as well marginalized women and minorities. In the selection process women and girls from rural areas will be favourised. Direct beneficiaries of the program will be 25 women and girls, from the age 15-30, from Prishtina and surrounding area (incl. Obiliq and Fushe Kosove) with the focus on rural areas.

Target Area:	Prishtina and surrounding area (incl. Obiliq and Fushe Kosove) with the focus on rural areas.
Overall Objective:	The project aims to address the lack of knowledge and access to information that women have about their socio-economic rights, how to properly seek employment opportunities, increase their knowledge of their rights in their workplace. The project will aim to achieve these through two components the technical and soft skills ones. The technical skills training program will emphasize on-the-job training (to expand contacts and increase experience of female job seekers) and ensure strong employer engagement (which can minimize discrimination). The soft skills program will focus on helping women access land, credit, and productive inputs, while strengthening soft skills (e.g., self-esteem, perseverance) and expanding social networks (e.g., through mentoring, access to business associations, etc.)
