Summary of the grant:	The cultural center Termokiss, located in Prishtina, has served for nine years as an inclusive space for the community, offering over 1,000 free cultural and social activities, organized and led by the community itself. Termokiss has been a safe space for marginalized groups such as the LGBTQ+ community, women, the elderly, children and youth. It promotes direct democracy and the active participation of citizens in the cultural and public life of the city. Currently, space is facing serious threats after a series of systematic attacks that have directly affected the continuity of the initiative's operations. In the face of the lack of institutional response, the community has taken concrete steps to ensure the protection and further functioning of Termokiss.



This project aims to intervene urgently to restore a sense of safety in space and to guarantee the continuation of cultural and social activities. Objectives include the installation of garage doors over the glass doors, which are continuously being attacked. The activities will be carried out through technical assessments and collaboration with specialized companies.

The intervention will take place in the Termokiss building, located in the Dardania neighborhood of Prishtina. Beyond the physical safety measures, the intervention represents an act of solidarity and civic resistance against fear and violence, creating capacities for further responses to protect similar alternative spaces in the city and beyond.
