Overall Objective:	The goal of the proposed project is to empower marginalized women from three municipalities in Kosovo by building their knowledge and leadership capacity to participate in decision making processes at the village, municipal and central level and engage men as allies.
Activities:	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1.1. Identification of 90 women (30 per municipality) who will participate in project activities and represent the interests of their community.</li> <li>1.2. Implement two training days with 30 women in each municipality on the rights of women, civic engagement and relevant legislation &amp; process of running for leadership positions at the village or municipal level.</li> <li>2.1. Identify experts who will facilitate the workshop on the preparation of the Advocacy Plan for the groups of women in each of the three municipalities.</li> <li>2.2. Implement a two-day workshop with 30 women in each municipality to prepare an Advocacy Plan addressing a. the rights of women; b. health care; c. environmental protection and d. economic development/employment.</li> <li>2.3. Finalize the Advocacy Plans for each group of women in the three municipalities.</li> <li>3.1. WfWI leadership meet with MAWC in each municipality to explain the project and ask for cooperation.</li> <li>3.2. Organise outreach between 30 women and MACW in each of the three municipalities.</li> <li>3.3. Facilitate visits for women to attend municipal assembly meetings and public hearings in their local area, and organize salons in each municipality where women can present their Advocacy Plans to different representatives of their Municipal Assembly (including the MAWC).</li> <li>4.1. WfWI will conduct meetings with the Parliament Women Caucus (PWC) to introduce and explain the project.</li> <li>4.2. Organize exchange trips for 90 women to visit Parliament to meet with PWC members, and at least 4 PWC members from different political parties to visit a few villages.</li> <li>5.1. Identification of 45-50 men (around 15 per municipality) who will benefit from our training on supporting women's social and economic empowerment.</li> <li>5.2. Implement two day trainings with 15-17 men in each municipality on the role of women in decision making and the role of men in supporting this process.</li> </ol>
