Overall Objective:	Improve the employability of 240 high school students, through involvement in targeted extracurricular activities, as well as provision of transferable skills required in the current labor market, such as IT and foreign language skills.
Activities:	<p>The project activities are as below:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● 3 workshop with topics such as: Technology skills, Critical Thinking and Problem-Solving skills; Leadership and Communications skills. ● Creating Informed Workers with study visit and job shadowing; ● Reaching the Difficult to Reach - 70 youth from socially vulnerable families will receive additional computer, and/or foreign language courses for a period of an academic year; ● Putting Skills in to Practice - the project will provide volunteer matching support and create linkages with the various existing volunteer initiatives and platforms. ● Sustaining the New Skills and Approaches - The contracted experts will prepare training manuals and provide Training of Trainers workshop for 28 selected teachers to ensure the sustainability of the project.
Expected Results:	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Two hundred forty young women and men from five schools in Mitrovica, Gjakova, and Fushe Kosova are involved in extracurricular activities on IT, design thinking, wiki academy, and voluntarism opportunities. 2. Thirty students from Mitrovica, Gjakova, and Fushe Kosova are provided with experiential learning opportunities. 3. Seventy students from socially vulnerable families are provided with the possibility to acquire key transferable skills on information technology and foreign languages. 4. Twenty-eight teachers of high schools in Mitrovica, Gjakova, and Fushe Kosova acquire training manuals and skills to educate future generations on the selected topics.

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
