Public consultation opened on 109 draft policies

Fewer draft laws, strategies, and concept documents than in 2024, due to the caretaker Government's limited powers.

The quality of consultation remained limited

The reality of public consultation shows that, although 109 draft policies were published for consultation and 85% of consultations met the minimum period of 15 working days:



Early involvement was minimal



Participation through the Platform was low



Few consultation meetings were held



CSO comments had a partial impact



Important policies were not consulted with the public

Early involvement was minimal



NGOs were rarely included by institutions in working groups



0 initial public meetings recorded before the drafting process began
(0 in 2024 as well)



Consultation took place at advanced stages, often on near-final drafts of policies

The Online Platform was "Offline" again

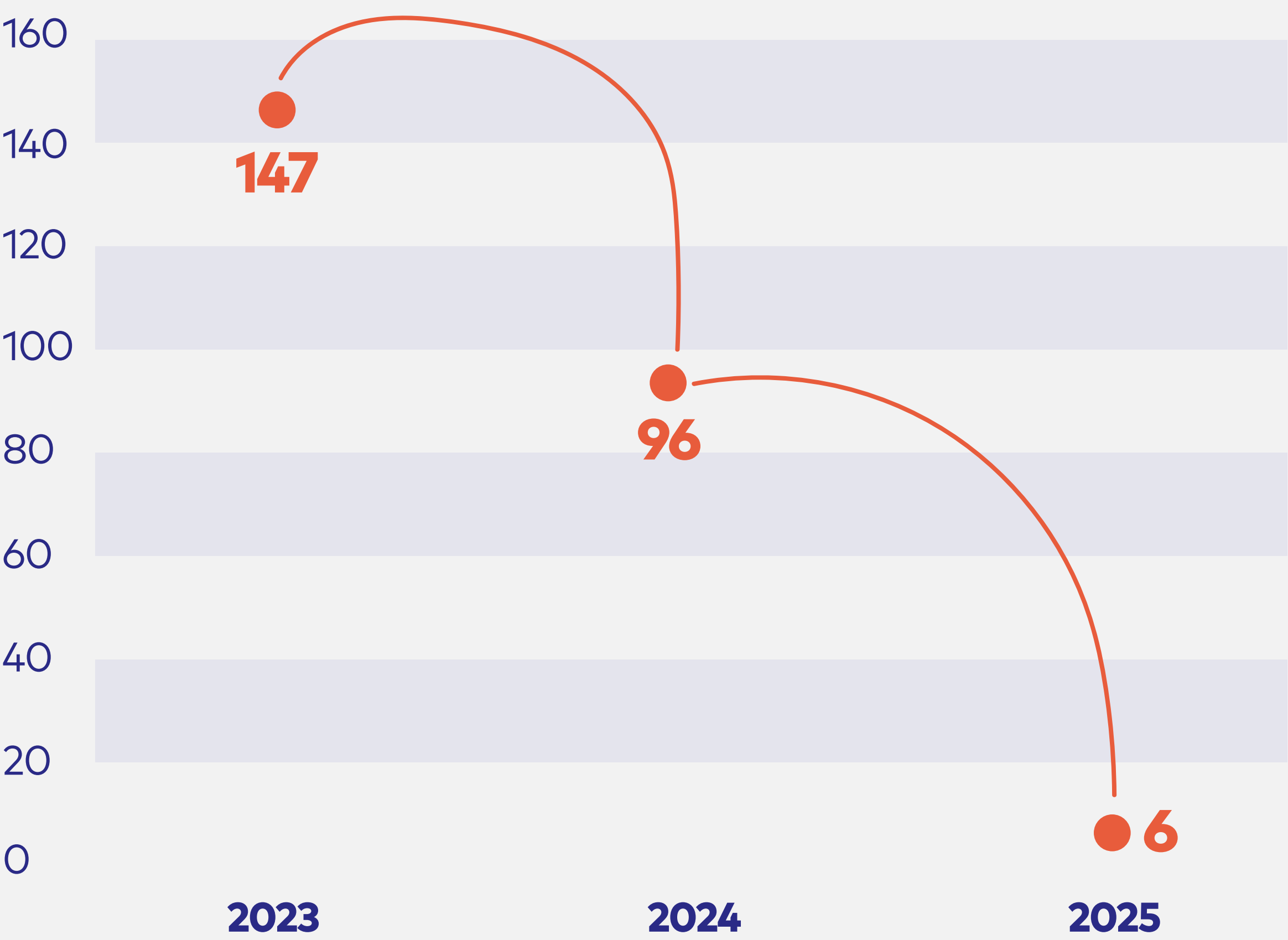
Similar to 2024, the Platform was out of operation for more than two months.



Even when the Platform was operational, CSOs reported technical problems that prevented them from submitting contributions.

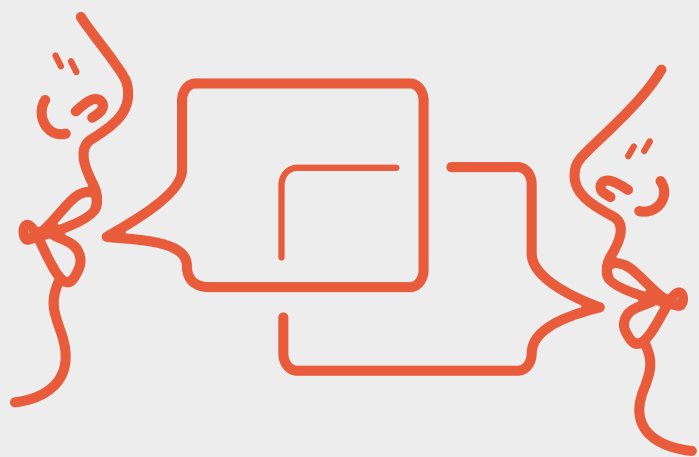
Participation through the Platform was low

Frequent Platform outages contributed to the decline in contributions. In 2025, the number of contributions through the Platform was the lowest since its launch in 2017.

Only 6 consultative meetings with stakeholders identified in the final consultation reports*



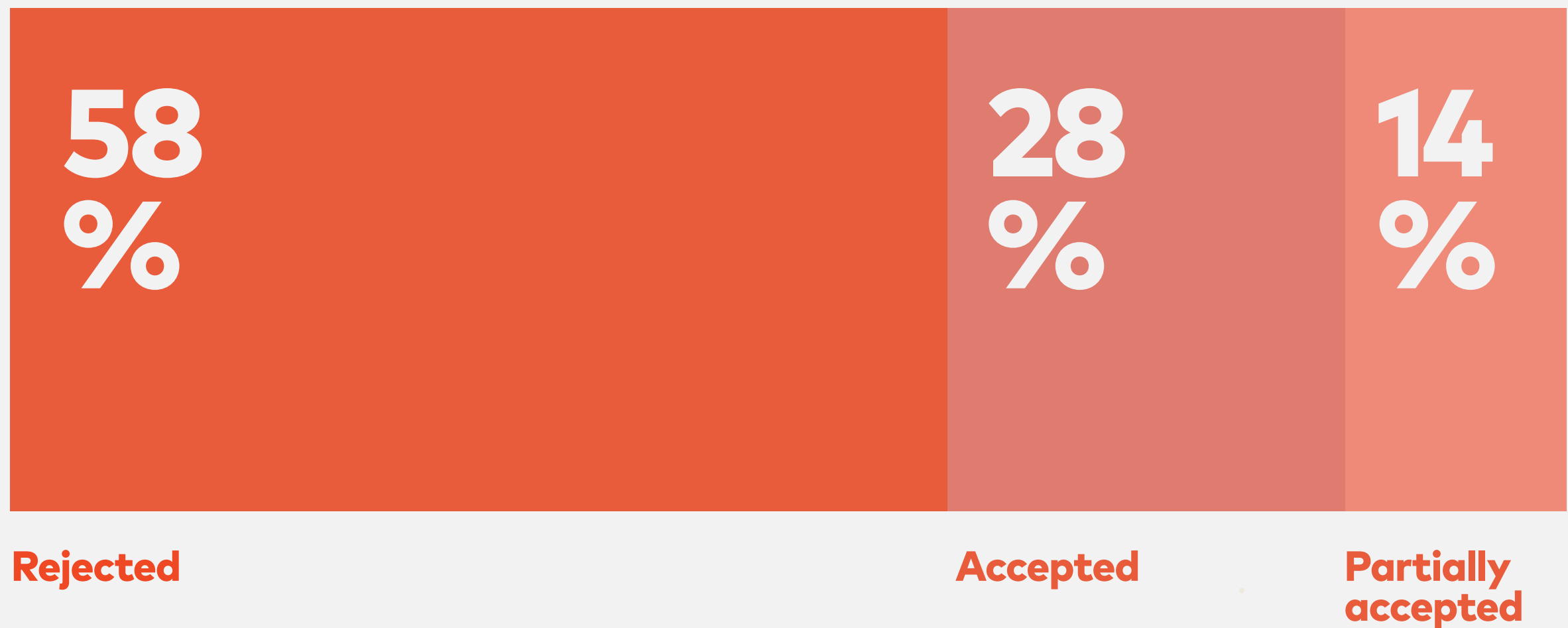
Public consultation relied on written/online consultation

45%

This lack of transparency:
Weakens public trust in the consultation process and discourages participation

Important policies were not consulted with the public

30% of policies adopted by the Government* were not consulted on the Online Platform.
(20% in 2024)
